Tips for Comprehension & Fluency




<u>Browse</u>- Take a picture walk through the story to get an idea of what it might be about. Point to any tricky words and sound them out to make sure you understand them before you begin reading.

<u>Brainstorm</u>- What do you know about this subject? What do you hope to learn?

Predict - What do you think will happen in this story?

Question- Who? What? When? Where? Why? How?





Predict- What do you think will happen next?


Question- Who? What? When? Where? Why? How?

<u>Connect</u>- Does it connect to other books you've read, things you've experienced, or events around the world?


Reread- Read it again faster and for a better understanding.
